What The Palm Beach Center Does

- ① **Holding** colleges accountable for ensuring a safe environment for Jewish students. [[Read the Department of Education's May 7, 2024, "Dear Colleague" letter.](#)]
- ② **Advocating** for mandatory training on antisemitism, guided by the [IHRA Working Definition](#).
- ③ **Encouraging** schools to enforce rules, discipline violators, and [prioritize Jewish student safety](#).
- ④ **Know** [your rights on campus](#) – from receiving fair treatment by faculty to expressing one's views freely in academic settings.
- ⑤ **Actively** documenting [antisemitic incidents](#) and demanding swift, accountable responses.
